## **Prices & Availability**

All the plants described in this catalog (and a sizable number of others we had no space to list) are under production and will be available for purchase here at the nursery at some point during the 2011 gardening season (if the deer and friends do not eat them and Mother Nature cooperates by providing the proper growing conditions, etc.).

To avoid an unnecessary journey, you might want to call before visiting to find if that special plant you desire is currently available. Do not hesitate to ask for plants you don't find listed in the following pages. We may have them, as well.

Our plants are grown in limited numbers and will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis. The prices in this catalog are for plants sold to and picked up by our customers here at the nursery and replace any previous prices. Prices are subject to change without notice.

## **Ordering & Shipping**

We can arrange to ship plant material via U.P.S. to those who cannot shop here in person. All orders must be received by the end of the day on Friday to be processed during the weekend and picked up by U.P.S. on our ship days, Monday and Tuesday. We accept orders only for plants currently in stock and which can be safely packaged and transported. Orders are processed immediately according to the schedule described above. We are unable to hold orders for later shipment or process backorders.

We would prefer these transactions be conducted by charge card. We accept MasterCard®, Visa®, Discover®, and American Express®. After U.P.S. has picked up your order and we can determine the shipping charges, we will bill your card and mail you an itemized invoice. # Perennials

## ACANTHUS a-kan'-thus

*Acanthus mollis* 'Latifolius' ..... **Bear's Breeches**  
 2-2.5' x 2-3' **Partial shade** May  
 Very large, glossy-green leaves give an almost tropical foliar accent to shady spots. Plants go dormant for a while in late-summer. When weather begins to cool, low crowns of evergreen foliage emerge which, if not killed to the ground by especially harsh winter weather, will send up spikes of rose to lavender flowers in early-summer. **1 gal. 9.50**

## ACHILLEA ak-i-lee'-a

*Achillea* 'Coronation Gold' ..... **Yellow**  
 2-3' x 2' **Full sun** May-Jul  
 Golden-yellow flower heads similar to those of *A. filipendulina* but not as tall. Grayish-tinted foliage. A fine selection for smaller gardens. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Achillea millefolium* 'Oertel's Rose' ..... **Yellow**  
 1-1.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Nov  
**A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION.** Large plates of rose-pink flowers age to white on sturdy twelve-inch stems. Cutting for arrangements encourages fresh flower stems through the season. Deep-green, fern-like foliage quickly forms dense mats in cultivated soils. **1 gal. 6.50**

## ACORUS ay'-kor-us

*Acorus gramineus* 'Ogon' ..... **Dwarf Sweet Flag**  
 .75-1' x 1' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
 Grown for its glowing chartreuse- and cream-variegated leaves, this Sweet Flag slowly spreads into a broad clump of evergreen, grassy foliage. Moist or boggy conditions are ideal but adapts well to adequately irrigated garden soil. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Acorus gramineus* 'Variegatus' ..... **Dwarf Sweet Flag**  
 .75-1 x 1' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
 Slow-growing evergreen groundcover for moist or boggy sites. Narrow, grass-like green leaves are attractively variegated with cream stripes. Adapts well to ordinary garden soil if provided adequate moisture. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Acorus gramineus* 'Minimus Aureus' ..... **Dwarf Sweet Flag**  
 .25-.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
 Dainty, evergreen tufts of aromatic, grassy foliage slowly spread to form golden mats in moist to boggy soil conditions. Adapts to ordinary garden soil if supplied adequate moisture. A little afternoon shade is appreciated when grown in the Deep South. **1 qt. 4.50**

## AESCULUS es'-kew-lus

*Aesculus parviflora* (N) ..... **Bottlebrush Buckeye**  
 8-12' x 8-15' **Full sun/pt shade** July  
 Large, suckering native shrub with deep-green, palmate foliage produces sparkling-white, bottlebrush-like panicles of flowers in July. Prefers a fertile, moist but well-drained acid soil. **1 gal. 16.50**  
**3 gal. 38.50**

*Aesculus pavia* (N) ..... **Red Buckeye**  
 8-12' x 10-20' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr  
 This handsome deciduous native shrub has lustrous, deep-green, palmately compound foliage and produces plumes of bright-red blooms in the spring followed by fruits in the fall. Plant in moist, well-drained soil. Flowering is best in sunnier locations. **1 gal. 16.50**

## AGASTACHE un-gah'-stuh-kee

*Agastache foeniculum* 'Blue Spike' (N) ..... **Blue Anise Hyssop**  
 2-4' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
 Native plants whose upright branches are cloaked in aromatic, medium-green leaves. Dense, fuzzy spikes of tiny, two-lipped, blue flowers open during the summer and attract hummingbirds and bees. At home in either the herb garden or in the border. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Agastache foeniculum* 'Snow Spike' (N) ..... **White Anise Hyssop**  
 2-3' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
 Woolly spikes composed of small white flowers closely-packed in whorls appear at the ends of erect stems in the summer. Blooms can be used as garnish for salads and the leaves yield a licorice-flavored tea. **1 gal. 6.50**

## AKEBIA ak-ee'-bi-a

*Akebia quinata* ..... **Five Leaf Akebia**  
 30-40' x 10-20' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
 Vigorous, semi-evergreen twining vine produces clusters of almost inconspicuous purple flowers under its canopy of deep-green foliage in early-spring. Compound leaves of five finger-shaped leaflets are especially attractive dancing when the wind blows. **3 gal. 26.50**

## ALCEA al'see-uh

*Alcea rosea* 'Simplex Mix' ..... **Hollyhock**  
 4-5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Soaring plants provide leafy spikes of single flowers during the summer in a mix of colors including pink, rose, red, purple, and white. Best blooming and healthiest plants in sunny locations with fertile, moist but well-draining soil and good air circulation. **1 gal. 6.50**

## ALCHEMILLA al-ke-mil'-a

*Alchemilla mollis* 'Thriller' ..... **Lady's Mantle**  
 1.5-1.75' x 1.5-2' **Partial shade** Apr-May  
 In the spring, loose sprays of small, bright-yellow flowers create a colorful haze above clumps of velvety, fan-shaped, gray-green leaves which gather morning dewdrops to sparkle jewel-like in the early sun. An easy plant to grow in humus-rich soil which does not stay too dry. **1 gal. 6.50**

## ALLIUM al-i'-um

*Allium schoenoprasum* ..... **Chives**  
 1-1.5' x 1.5' **Full sun** Apr-Jun  
 Rosy-lavender flower heads spring from clumps of tubular, grasslike foliage. The flowers are as useful in the kitchen as they are lovely in the garden. Sprinkle them on salads or make delicious "Chive-Blossom Vinegar." Aphids have an appetite for the tender new foliage of early-spring. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Allium senescens* 'Glaucum' ..... **German Garlic**  
 .5-.75' x .75' **Full sun** Aug-Sep  
 Late-flowering ornamental Onion with distinctive low, swirling, glaucous foliage and umbels of lilac flowers in late-summer. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Allium tuberosum* ..... **Garlic Chives**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun** Jul-Aug  
 Tall stems with white flower clusters make this an excellent herb for both the herb and flower gardens. Forms large colonies if allowed to seed. Foliage and flowers have a very distinct, mild garlic flavor. **1 gal. 6.50**

**AMSONIA** am-soh'-ni-a

*Amsonia hubrichtii* (N) ..... **Arkansas Bluestar**  
 3-3.5' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Clusters of light-blue, stary flowers open in spring at the ends of stems covered by narrow, grassy leaves. Foliage stays attractive through the summer turning a brilliant, golden-yellow in autumn. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Amsonia tabernaemontana* 'Montana' (N) ..... **Bluestar**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 A more dwarfish form than the species with somewhat larger leaves and richer blue flowers. A heavy bloomer with thick, compact stems that hold themselves upright. **1 gal. 7.50**

**ANEMONE** a-nem'-oh-nee

*Anemone x hybrida* 'Honorine Jobert' ..... **Windflower**  
 2-2.5' x 2' **Partial shade** Aug-Sep  
 Blooms with a single row of pure-white petals surrounding central golden stamens are held above dense, green foliage on tall, branching flower stems. Performs best in soils rich in humus and when planted in sites with some shade during the hotter part of the day. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Anemone x hybrida* 'Richard Arends' ..... **Windflower**  
 3-3.5' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** Aug-Sep  
 Rising above mounds of substantial, dark-green foliage are tall, branching stems that bear single pink blooms. Japanese Anemones seldom need staking and make excellent cut flowers. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Anemone x hybrida* 'Whirlwind' ..... **Windflower**  
 3-4' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** Aug-Sep  
 White, semi-double flowers are produced on tall, branching stems above mounds of attractive, dark-green leaves. Good low-maintenance plant essentially free from pests and diseases. **1 gal. 8.50**

**AQUILEGIA** ak-wi-lee'-ji-a

*Aquilegia alpina* ..... **Columbine**  
 1-2' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Large, bluish-purple flowers with recurved spurs on medium height stems are held above stocky clumps of robust foliage. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Aquilegia canadensis* (N) ..... **American Columbine**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Tiny blooms with lemon-yellow petals and deep-red sepals and spurs appear in the spring. Rosettes of foliage have a deep-pink tinge in early-spring and turn green as the season warms. Easy to cultivate. Colonizes freely in lean, well-drained soil. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Aquilegia flabellata* 'Nana Alba' ..... **Dwarf Columbine**  
 1-1.25' x 1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Robust plant with glaucous foliage and pure-white, nodding flowers with short spurs. A strong grower in humus-rich, well-drained soil. Seems less susceptible to leaf miners than some of the hybrids. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Aquilegia chrysantha* ..... **Golden Columbine**  
 3-3.75' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Jun  
 Bright-yellow, long-spurred blooms towering above clumps of lacy foliage are produced profusely from spring to early-summer. Best grown in lean, loamy soil amended so that it retains adequate moisture. A tall species that may need staking. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Aquilegia vulgaris* 'Grandmother's Garden' .. **Columbine**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 This vintage form of "Granny's Bonnets" has been grown in gardens for many years. The short-spurred, fluffy, nodding flowers open in late-spring on top of tall stems and may be colored pale-rose, violet, wine-red, or white. Attractive to hummingbirds and butterflies, the blooms are also suitable for use in fresh arrangements. **1 gal. 6.50**

**ARTEMISIA** ar-tee-miz'-i-a

*Artemisia dracunculus* 'Sativa' ..... **French Tarragon**  
 1.5-2' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Deciduous  
 Shiny, green, aromatic foliage which is widely used as a culinary herb. Propagated from root divisions. Old stems should be cut to the ground in early-spring to make way for fresh new growth. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Artemisia lactiflora* 'Guizhou' ..... **White Mugwort**  
 3-4.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Plumes of creamy-white, button-like blooms open in the summer atop imposing plants with feathery foliage. Leaves and stems are a deep, blackish-green providing a striking contrast to the much lighter-colored flowers. **1 gal. 7.50**

**ARUM** ay'-rum

*Arum italicum* ..... **Italian Arum**  
 1-1.5' x 1' **Partial shade** Apr-May  
 Thick, fleshy stalks bearing cream-yellow spadices hooded by showy spathes are followed in the fall by red berries and fresh, arrow-shaped leaves marbled with pale veins. Foliage persists through the winter but vanishes with the arrival of summer heat. Plant in humusy, moist, well-drained soils. **1 qt. 6.50**  
**1 gal. 12.50**

**ASARUM** a-sar'-um

*Asarum splendens* ..... **Wild Ginger**  
 .5-.75' x .75-1' **Pt shade/shade** Evergreen  
 Evergreen, stoloniferous plants gradually form low, compact colonies in shady spots with consistently moist but well-drained, neutral-to-acid soils. Glossy, deep-green leaves have a lovely silvery mottling that occurs in regular patterns. **1 gal. 8.50**

**ASPIDISTRA** as-pi-dis'-truh

*Aspidistra elatior* ..... **Cast-iron Plant**  
 1.5-2' x 2-3' **Pt shade/shade** Evergreen  
 Easily cultivated, evergreen, drought-tolerant plant with lustrous dark-green leaves. Best in partial to full shade in deep, rich, well-drained soil. Also makes an excellent house plant. **1 gal. 14.50**

**ASTER** as'-ter

*Aster carolinianus* (N) ..... **Climbing Aster**  
 6-8' x 2-2.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Oct-Nov  
 Panicles of mauve, yellow-centered Daisies open in the fall at the ends of long, arching stems. A fetching consort for Climbing Roses or Clematis, this Aster may also be planted in the shrub border where its branches can meander through those of nearby plants. **1 gal. 7.50**

*Aster ericoides* (N) ..... **Heath Aster**  
 3-4' x 3-4' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Nov  
 A blizzard of tiny white Daisies held in sprays appears in the fall on big, bushy plants with stiff branches and small, needlelike leaves. Best flowering when grown in full sun. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Aster laevis* (N) ..... **Smooth Aster**  
 3-3.5' x 3-3.5' **Full sun** Aug-Oct  
 Cone-shaped panicles of blue, yellow-centered Asters are produced over a long period beginning in late-summer and extending into the fall above clumping plants with maroon stems. **1 gal. 6.50**

- Aster novae-angliae* ‘Purple Dome’ (N) ..... **New England Aster**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Sep-Nov  
 Compact plants are covered in dark-purple, yellow-centered Asters in late-fall. Small size and mounding growth habit make it suitable for container cultivation. A Mt. Cuba Center for the Study of Piedmont Flora introduction. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Aster oblongifolius* ‘Jane Bath’ (N) ..... **Jane's Aster**  
 2-2.5' x 1-1.5'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Oct-Nov  
**A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION.** Autumn-blooming plants are covered with lavender-blue, yellow-centered Daisies from October through November. Named in honor of garden designer Jane Bath who discovered and shared this plant with us. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Aster oblongifolius* ‘Rachel Jackson’ (N) ..... **Rachel's Aster**  
 2.5-3' x 2.5-3'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Oct-Nov  
 A special selection from the garden of Rachael Jackson, this Aster is one of the last ones to bloom. In late-fall, the compact, densely-branched plants become mounds of lavender and continue to provide an astonishingly colorful display even after the first light frosts. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Aster tataricus* ..... **Tatarian Aster**  
 6-7' x 2.5-3'      **Full sun**      Sep-Nov  
 Small, lavender-blue flowers are arranged in dense terminal clusters on tall, stout stems. Lower leaves are large, broad, and up to two feet long providing a strong foliage texture from mid-spring through the summer. Flower stalks may be cut in early- to mid-summer if a shorter habit is desired. **1 gal. 7.50**
- ASTILBE** uh-stil'-bee
- Astilbe x arendsii* ‘Bridal Veil’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2'      **Partial shade**      May-Jun  
 Shining plumes of snow-white blooms arch above ferny, dark-green mounds of foliage in late-spring. Performs best when planted in deep, rich soil and given adequate moisture during the growing season. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe x arendsii* ‘Fanal’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 1.5-2' x 1.5'      **Partial shade**      May-Jun  
 Darkest of the red-flowering varieties. Long-lasting flowers and deep-bronze foliage. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe x arendsii* ‘Ostrich Plume’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 2-3' x 1.5-2'      **Partial shade**      May-Jun  
 Mid-season, salmon-pink blooms are produced in gracefully arching spikes rising above attractive ferny foliage. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe x arendsii* ‘Rhineland’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 1.5-2' x 2'      **Partial shade**      May-Jun  
 Bright, clear-pink flowers on dense, upright spikes. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe chinensis* ‘Pumila’ ..... **Chinese Astilbe**  
 1-2' x 1.5-2'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Jun-Jul  
 Mauve-pink flower spikes appear in early-summer above low, dense, Fernlike foliage. Excellent planted in the front of the border. Considered by many to be the most drought-tolerant Astilbe; however, ample moisture must be provided for this as well as other Astilbes to ensure proper performance. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe x rosea* ‘Peach Blossom’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 2-2.5' x 2'      **Partial shade**      May-Jun  
 A beautiful, pale-pink variety with airy, arching sprays of fragrant flowers. A strong grower with bronze-tinted foliage. **1 gal. 7.50**

- Astilbe simplicifolia* ‘Henny Graafland’ ..... **Dwarf Astilbe**  
 .75-1' x 1'      **Partial shade**      Jun-Jul  
 Airy, branching sprays of star-shaped, light rosy-pink blooms in early-summer above compact plants with abundant bronze-hued foliage. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe simplicifolia* ‘Sprite’ ..... **Dwarf Astilbe**  
 .75-1' x 1'      **Partial shade**      Jun-Jul  
 A popular selection made by Alan Bloom of Bressingham Gardens, this dwarf Astilbe's shell-pink plumes rise above bronze-hued, ferny foliage. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe simplicifolia* ‘White Sensation’ ..... **Dwarf Astilbe**  
 1-1.5' x 1.5-2'      **Partial shade**      Jun-Jul  
 Feathery, upright and arching panicles of small, pure-white, starry blooms appear above attractive compact clumps of bronzy-green foliage in the summer. Cultivate in humus-rich, moist but well-drained soil. **1 gal. 7.50**
- Astilbe taquetii* ‘Superba’ ..... **Astilbe**  
 3-3.5' x 2-2.5'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Jun-Jul  
 Vivid, raspberry-pink flowers on strong, erect spikes. One of the later-flowering *Astilbes*. Bold, mahogany-tinted foliage with coarse, rounded leaves. **1 gal. 7.50**

**ATHYRIUM** a-thir'-i-um

- Athyrium nipponicum* ‘Pictum’ ..... **Japanese Painted Fern**  
 1-1.5' x 1.5-2'      **Pt shade/shade**      Deciduous  
 Valued for its beautifully-colored new foliage which is soft-gray with blue and red hues. Prefers a rich, loamy soil with a little sun to develop the best color. Foliage is deciduous. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Athyrium filix-femina* (N) ..... **Lady Fern**  
 2-3' x 2-2.5'      **Pt shade/shade**      Deciduous  
 This hardy North American native Fern has finely-divided, yellow-green fronds and is easily cultivated in moist, humus-rich soils. Dormant in the winter, it awakens with a vigorous flush of fresh foliage in the spring. **1 gal. 8.50**

**BAPTISIA** bap-tiz'-i-a

- Baptisia australis* (N) ..... **False Blue Indigo**  
 3.5-4' x 3-3.5'      **Full sun/pt shade**      May  
 Indigo-blue flowers on spikes above arching foliage. Very sturdy and long-lived. A big, bushy perennial useful as an accent in the landscape or in the large border. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Baptisia* ‘Carolina Moonlight’ (N) ..... **Yellow Wild Indigo**  
 3-4' x 3-4'      **Full sun/pt shade**      May  
 Sturdy spikes of creamy, butter-yellow blooms rise from clumps of blue-green, deer-resistant foliage in late-spring. Long-lived, drought-tolerant plant is a chance cross between *B. sphaerocarpa* and *B. alba* discovered by Rob Gardner at the NC Botanical Gardens. **1 gal. 12.50**
- Baptisia pendula* (N) ..... **White Wild Indigo**  
 2-3' x 2-3'      **Full sun/pt shade**      Apr-May  
 Drought-tolerant and easily cultivated, this North Carolina native produces long spikes of white, pea-like flowers rising from plants with attractive, blue-green foliage in the spring. **1 gal. 12.50**

**BEGONIA** be-goh'-ni-a

Tall, sturdy spikes of tightly-packed, white, tubular blooms with speckled throats begin opening in late-spring above basal clumps of foliage. - Epimedium grandiflorum* ..... **Longspurred Barrenwort**

- Epimedium x youngianum 'Roseum'* ..... **Young's Barrenwort**  
.5-.75' x .75' **Pt shade/shade** Mar-Apr  
Small, slow-growing, deciduous clumps of foliage are the backdrop for rosy-lilac, three-quarter-inch, nodding flowers which open in the spring. New foliage has a reddish tinge. Leaves may turn crimson in the fall. Requires humus-rich soil. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Epimedium x youngianum 'Niveum'* ..... **Young's Barrenwort**  
.75-1' x 1' **Pt shade/shade** Mar-Apr

**EQUISETUM** ek-kwi-see'-tum

- Equisetum hyemale* (N) ..... **Horsetail Grass**  
4-5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
Prehistoric, rushlike ornamental resembling leafless bamboo. Thin, evergreen stems spread vigorously in all but hard, dry soils. A great addition to an oriental setting or water garden. Avoid planting where spreading is not desired. Foliage is poisonous to livestock. **1 gal. 7.50**

**ERAGROSTIS** er-uh-gros'-tis

- Eragrostis spectabilis* (N) ..... **Purple Lovegrass**  
1.5-2' x 2-3' **Full sun** Aug-Oct  
Misty sprays comprised of stiff, wiry stems bearing reddish-purple spikelets float above low-growing, dense tufts of leaf blades in late-summer. This drought-tolerant native grass spreads by rhizomes or seeds. Best in moist, sandy soils in sunny situations. **1 gal. 6.50**

**ERIGERON** e-rij'-er-on

- Erigeron flagellaris 'Profusion'* (N) ..... **Trailing Fleabane**  
.75-1' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Aug  
Small, white and pink daisy flowers cover low plants with trailing foliage almost all season long. A great performer for walls, window boxes, or the front of the border. Tolerant of hot sun and dry soils. **1 qt. 4.50**

**EUCOMIS** yew-koh'-mis

- Eucomis comosa 'Megaru'* ..... **Pineapple Lily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug  
Cylindrical spikes rising above basal rosettes of green, straplike leaves are closely-packed with small, white flowers and crowned by tufts of green bracts from mid- to late-summer. Blooms open from the bottom up and are very attractive to butterflies and bees. **1 gal. 12.50**
- Eucomis comosa 'Sparkling Burgundy'* .... **Pineapple Lily**  
2.5-3.5' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug  
Stalks bearing spikes of small, star-shaped, whitish flowers topped with tufts of burgundy-blushed bracts rise from rosettes of sword-shaped burgundy leaves in late-summer. Blooms open from the bottom up. The long-lasting inflorescences resemble Pineapples. **1 gal. 12.50**
- Eucomis comosa 'Tugela Ruby'* ..... **Pineapple Lily**  
2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug  
Spikes of small, starry, rosy-pink flowers crowned by tufts of red-purple bracts open mid- to late-summer rising from rosettes of deep, red-purple, sword-shaped leaves. Blooms open from the bottom up and attract butterflies and bees. Long-lasting cut-flower. **1 gal. 12.50**
- Eucomis vandermerwei 'Octopus'* ..... **Dwarf Pineapple Lily**  
.5-.75' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug  
In the summer, small rosettes of purple-splattered, straplike leaves give rise to dark stalks bearing tiny, starry, purple flowers in spikes crowned by tufts of purple-speckled bracts. Plants are of a size that makes them ideal for container cultivation. **1 gal. 12.50**

**EUPATORIUM** yew-pat-ohr'-i-um

- Eupatorium coelestinum* (N) ..... **Hardy Ageratum**  
3-3.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Oct  
Bright, violet-blue flowers are clustered on a broad, flat flower head. May be cut back early in the season to control height. Spreads freely from stolons and from seeds. Provides beautiful late-season color and wonderful cut flowers. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Eupatorium maculatum* 'Atropurpureum' (N) .... **Joe Pye Weed**

5-7' x 2.5-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Sep  
Flat-headed clusters of rich-purple flowers held aloft by wine-blotched stems open in late-summer and persist into early-fall. Large, moisture-loving plants we grow from our stock specimens provide a stately architectural presence for the back of the border.

*Eupatorium dubium* 'Little Joe' (N) ..... **Joe Pye Weed**

3-3.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Oct  
Fluffy heads of small white flowers. An easily cultivated addition to the fall garden. (Synonym: *Ageratina altissima*)

**FILIPENDULA** fil-i-pen'-dew-la

*Filipendula purpurea* 'Elegans' ..... **Meadowsweet**

2.5-3.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Numerous flattened heads of small white flowers with conspicuous red stamens appear in early-summer atop the wiry, purplish stems of vigorous plants with elegant, palmate leaves. Best grown in rich, humusy soil kept evenly and consistently moist.

**FOENICULUM** fee-nik'-yew-lum

*Foeniculum vulgare* 'Purpureum' ..... **Copper Fennel**

4-5' x 2-3' **Full sun** Jun-Jul  
Small yellow flowers in umbels rise above upright clumps of finely-textured, deep bronze-red foliage. Valuable for both its ornamental foliage and its anise-flavored seeds and stems. Does best in soil that is not too heavy or wet. Prolific self-seeder.

**FRAGARIA** fruh-gay'-ri-uh

*Fragaria vesca* 'Golden Alexandria' .... **Alpine Strawberry**

.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Aug  
A dwarf Strawberry with small white flowers that produces fruit all season long with good culture. A runnerless variety with attractive golden foliage that makes a good edging plant.

**GALIUM** gay'-li-um

*Galium odoratum* ..... **Sweet Woodruff**

.5' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-May  
Clusters of small, white, star-shaped flowers appear in the spring. Foliage is used in making May Wine. Sweet fragrance of leaves increases as they dry. A great groundcover for partially shady spots with moist, acid soil.

*Gaura lindheimeri* 'Whirling Butterflies' (N) .... **Wand Flower**

Clusters of one-inch diameter flowers with deep-magenta petals and red calyces open in the spring on spreading plants with deeply-divided and aromatic foliage.

*Geranium sanguineum* ..... **Bloody Cranesbill**

.5-1' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jul  
Masses of magenta-pink flowers cover mats of deeply-divided foliage. Plants will spread easily in average garden soil. Foliage turns deep-crimson in the fall. An exceptionally easy plant to cultivate. An asset to any garden.

A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION. Single, four-inch diameter Sunflowers with lemon-yellow, overlapping petals open in early-fall on plants propagated from a *Helianthus angustifolius* seedling whose pollinator was *H. giganteus*. Growth habit is similar to that of its Swamp Sunflower mother plant. **1 gal. 7.50**

**HELIOPSIS** hee-li-op'-sis

*Heliopsis helianthoides* 'Tuscan Sun' (N) ..... **False Sunflower**  
1-1.5' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
Sturdy, compact plants with rich-green foliage supply abundant Daisy flowers during the summer, each with yellow ray petals surrounding a circular golden center. Excellent cut flower. **1 gal. 8.50**

**HELLEBORUS** hell-e-bor'-us

*Helleborus orientalis* ..... **Lenten Rose**  
1-1.5' x 1.5-2' **Pt shade/shade** Feb-Apr  
Beautiful, nodding flowers resembling single Roses in colors from white, cream, or pink to purple appear in very early-spring above coarse, broad, palmate leaves which are evergreen. An indispensable addition to any shade garden. Spreads easily from seed. **1 gal. 8.75**

**HEMEROCALLIS** hem-er-o-kal'-is

*Hemerocallis 'Adah'* ..... **Daylily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jul  
Semi-evergreen, tetraploid Daylily produces three-inch, tangerine-pink blooms with tangerine throats. May rebloom if properly cultivated. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Alaqua'* ..... **Daylily**  
1.5-2' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Vigorous tetraploid Daylily begins blooming in late-spring producing cream-colored flowers with burgundy eye-zones. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Yasmin'* ..... **Daylily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jul  
Seven-inch, rose-pink blooms with white midribs and deeper rose eyezones over green throats. Semi-evergreen foliage. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Becky Lynn'* ..... **Daylily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
Rosy-pink, 6.75 inches in diameter, fragrant blooms with white midribs and chartreuse throats open in early-summer on stalks rising from diploid, semi-evergreen plants. Properly grown plants will rebloom. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Butterpat'* ..... **Daylily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Fragrant, two and one-half inch, medium-yellow flowers on twenty-inch stems. Plants go dormant during the winter. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Big Bird'* ..... **Daylily**  
2-3' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** June  
Big, seven-inch-diameter, green-throated, yellow blooms open in early-summer. Plants go completely dormant in the winter. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Canadian Border Patrol'* ..... **Daylily**  
2-2.5' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Vigorous tetraploid Daylily begins providing blooms in late-spring. Flowers are cream-colored with purplish eyezones and petal edges. May rebloom if carefully cultivated. Semi-evergreen. **1 gal. 9.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Chicago Apache'* ..... **Daylily**  
2-2.25' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
Abundant five-inch diameter, glorious scarlet-red blooms with ruffly edges and chartreuse throats open at the ends of stout stalks during the summer. Robust tetraploid plants go completely dormant in the winter. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Chicago Blackout'* ..... **Daylily**  
2-2.25' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
Large, six-inch diameter, dark-red, almost-black blooms with yellow throats and petals with reddish midribs are produced during the summer by vigorous, tetraploid plants. **1 gal. 9.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Chicago Fire'* ..... **Daylily**  
2-2.75 x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
Six-inch diameter flowers are red with green throats. Tetraploid plants with semi-evergreen foliage. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Hemerocallis 'Chicago Sunrise'* ..... **Daylily**

- Hemerocallis* ‘Spacecoast Starburst’ ..... **Daylily**  
 2-2.25' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Aug  
 Big, six-inch, lavender blooms with frilly golden edges open in early-summer. Vigorous tetraploid Daylily is evergreen. Properly grown plants will rebloom. **1 gal. 9.50**
- Hemerocallis* ‘Startle’ ..... **Daylily**  
 2-2.25' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** June  
 Red, five-inches-wide, bi-colored blooms with ruffly cream margins open in the summer. Plants go completely dormant during the winter. **1 gal. 9.50**
- Hemerocallis* ‘Strawberry Candy’ ..... **Daylily**  
 2-2.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Large, ruffled, dark-pink blooms with yellow throats open in the summer on stalks rising from tetraploid plants with semi-evergreen foliage. Carefully cultivated plants may rebloom. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Hemerocallis* ‘Stella d'Oro’ ..... **Daylily**  
 1-2' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Aug  
 Petite, bell-shaped, canary-yellow flowers on pretty mounds of foliage. Reblooms when carefully and properly cultivated. Plants go completely dormant in the winter. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Hemerocallis* ‘White Temptation’ ..... **Daylily**  
 2.5-2.75' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Close-to-white, five-inch diameter blooms with chartreuse throats open during the balmy evenings of mid-summer. These multi-award-winning, diploid plants have semi-evergreen foliage. **1 gal. 9.50**

### HESPERIS hes'-per-is

- Hesperis matronalis* ..... **Sweet Rocket**  
 3-3.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Jun  
 Small, lavender-purple flowers in dense racemes are on tall stems. A heavy feeder that prefers moist, well-drained soil. Short-lived, so should be replaced occasionally with new seedlings. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Hesperis matronalis* ‘Alba’ ..... **White Sweet Rocket**  
 3-3.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Jun  
 Clusters of white, Phlox-like flowers on tall stems. Sweetly fragrant, especially in the evenings. Plants should be renewed every few years. Foliage is evergreen. **1 gal. 6.50**

### HEUCHERA hew'-ker-a

- Heuchera* ‘Key Lime Pie’ (N) ..... **Alumroot**  
 .75' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
 Spikes of small, bell-shaped blooms hover above evergreen mounds of heart-shaped, ruffle-edged leaves in late-spring and early-summer. Foliage color intensifies in cooler weather. Plant in well-draining, rich soil kept evenly moist. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Heuchera* ‘Licorice’ (N) ..... **Alumroot**  
 .75-1' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
 Dark, purplish-green, scalloped leaves form neat, evergreen mounds above which sturdy spikes of tiny, bell-shaped, salmon-pink flowers rise in late-spring and early-summer. Best grown in moist but well-draining soils under partial shade. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Heuchera* ‘Mocha Mint’ (N) ..... **Alumroot**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
 In late-spring and early-summer, sprays of small, bell-shaped, coral-pink flowers open on wiry stems floating above neatly mounding clumps of evergreen foliage. Small, scalloped leaves are silvery with green veins. Plant in well-draining but consistently-moist soil. **1 gal. 8.50**

- Heuchera* ‘Peach Melba’ (N) ..... **Alumroot**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
 Spikes of tiny, bell-shaped, creamy-pink flowers dangle from wiry, reddish stems above neat clumps of colorful foliage in late-spring and early-summer. Rounded and lobed leaves are painted peach, orange, and coppery-red hues whose shading changes as the seasons alternate. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Heuchera villosa* (N) ..... **Hairy Alumroot**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** Jul-Aug  
 In late-summer, misty sprays of small, greenish-white flowers on wiry stems float above neat clumps of attractive evergreen foliage. Plant in well-draining but moisture-retentive soil. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Heuchera villosa* ‘Citronelle’ (N) ..... **Hairy Alumroot**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** Jul-Aug  
 Panicles of small, creamy-white flowers open on wiry stems rising above compact clumps of glowing, chartreuse foliage in late-summer. Does best planted in rich, well-draining soil kept evenly moist. **1 gal. 8.50**
- Heuchera villosa* ‘Palace Purple’ (N) .... **Hairy Alumroot**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Partial shade** Jul-Aug  
 Small, almost-white flowers are produced on airy stems in late-summer. Most attractive feature is the deep-bronze, evergreen foliage which forms neat clumps. **1 gal. 8.50**

### HIBISCUS hy-bis'-kus

- Hibiscus coccineus* (N) ..... **Swamp Hibiscus**  
 6-7' x 4-5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Sep  
 Six-inch red flowers with long, extended stamens are produced in abundance from mid-summer into the fall. Plants are tall and robust with beautiful, deep-green, palmate foliage. Easy to cultivate in any soil but thrives in extremely moist spots. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Lycorus radiata* ..... **Spider Lily**  
 1-1.5' x 1' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Oct  
 Two-inch long, red trumpet flowers open in clusters in the fall on stalks rising from the ground before the foliage appears. The leaves emerge later and persist through the winter, disappearing in the summer. **1 gal. 12.50**

**LYSIMACHIA**ly-si-may'-ki-a

*Lysimachia japonica* 'Minutissima' ..... **Dwarf Creeping Jennie**  
 .1' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Flat, slowly-spreading green mats of densely-foliaged, prostrate stems make this interesting, tiny-leaved plant an excellent choice for growing between paving stones or in containers. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Lysimachia nummularia* 'Aurea' .... **Golden Creeping Jennie**  
 .25' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Small, yellow flowers go unnoticed amongst the beautiful, golden-yellow, rounded leaves. Vigorous, creeping stems quickly form dense, trailing mats. Easily grown in average-to-moist soils. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Lythrum virgatum* 'Morden Pink' ..... **Pink Loosestrife**

 Lovely, medium-pink flowers in one- to two-foot spikes are produced during most of the summer. Cutting back the faded flower stems encourages new ones to follow. **1 gal. 7.50**

**MACROTHELPTERIS**mak-kroh-thuh-lip'-ter-is

*Macrothelypteris torresiana* ..... **Mariana Maiden Fern**  
 3.5-4' x 3-4' **Full sun/pt shade** Deciduous  
 A very fast-growing, deciduous Fern with large, pale-green fronds. Plants prefer bright, indirect light but will tolerate full sun in consistently moist soils. Naturalizes freely from thick, aggressively-spreading rhizomes. **2 gal. 16.50**

**MATRICARIA**mat-tri-kay'-ri-a

*Matricaria parthenium* ..... **Bud Heist's Feverfew**  
 .75-1 x .75' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Charming, one-inch diameter Daisy flowers with creamy-yellow centers encircled by ruffs of small white petals are borne on branching, purplish stems rising above leafy, miniature plants with pungent foliage in early-summer. Tender perennial usually grown as an annual. **1 gal. 6.50**

**MATTEUCCIA**mat-tew'-chee-uh

*Matteucia struthiopteris* ..... **Ostrich Fern**  
 3-5' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Deciduous  
 Tall, graceful, yellow-green fronds resembling ostrich feathers unfurl in the spring. Prefers a moist, acid soil and a partly sunny exposure. Sturdy rhizomes will vigorously colonize rich soil. **1 gal. 9.50**

**MAZUS**may'-zus

*Mazus reptans* ..... **Mazus**  
 .2' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Dwarf, prostrate, creeping perennial plants form dense mats in moist, humus-rich, slightly acid soils. Appropriate for planting between paving stones or in the rock garden. Racemes of small, lavender flowers appear in the spring. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Mazus reptans* 'Albus' ..... **Mazus**  
 .2' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Spikes of small, white flowers appear in spring above prostrate mats of foliage. Plants make fast-growing, lush groundcover in humus-rich, moist, slightly acid soils. **1 qt. 4.50**

**MELISSA**muh-lis'-uh

*Melissa officinalis* ..... **Lemon Balm**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug

**MISCANTHUS** mis-kan'-thus

*Miscanthus sinensis* 'Variegatus' ..... **Variegated Maiden Grass**  
 4-4.5' x 3.5-4' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Frost  
 An outstanding ornamental grass with striking white- and green-striped foliage which forms large, arching clumps. **1 gal. 7.50**

**MONARDA** muh-nar'-da

*Monarda didyma* 'Jacob Cline' ..... **Bee Balm**  
 3-4' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Dark-red, nectar-rich blooms arranged in whirling clusters appear in the summer at the ends of the tall, stout stems of vigorously growing plants with aromatic foliage. This selection by Don Cline is regarded one of the most mildew-resistant. **1 gal. 6.50**

**MUHLENBERGIA** mew-len-ber'-gi-a

*Muhlenbergia capillaris* (N) ..... **Pink Muhly Grass**  
 2-4' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Nov  
 Delicate panicles of pink seed heads hover like a fine mist above slender tufts of narrow, dark-green leaf blades in mid- to late-fall. This native Grass is indigenous to dry open woodlands and savannahs in the South. Most effective planted in groups. **1 gal. 8.50**

**MYOSOTIS** my-o-soh'-tis

*Myosotis scorpioides* 'Oglethorpe' ..... **White Forget-Me-Not**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-Oct  
**A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION.** The same plant as the one described below in growth habit, vigor, and bloom time but with this difference: the petals of the tiny, yellow-centered flowers are an exceptionally pure-white. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Myosotis scorpioides* 'Semperflorens' ..... **True Forget-Me-Not**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-Oct  
 Masses of small, pale-blue flowers with yellow, white, or pink centers cover the vigorous, spreading stems and foliage. Blooming will be heavy in the spring and sporadic throughout the season. Soil should be rich and kept moist during long dry spells. **1 qt. 4.50**

**NEPETA** nep'-e-ta

*Nepeta x faassenii* 'Walker's Low' ..... **Catmint**  
 2-3' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Oct  
 Spikes of dark lavender-blue blooms appear in late-spring in the leaf axils of upright, spreading plants with crinkly blue-green foliage. Shearing plants when flowers begin to fade stimulates new growth and reblooming through the summer and into the fall. Deer-resistant plants are attractive to hummingbirds and bees. **1 gal. 6.50**

**OENOTHERA** ee-no-theer'-a

*Oenothera perennis* (N) ..... **Sundrops**  
 2' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Beautiful, cup-shaped, yellow flowers on small, wiry stems. After flowering, foliage turns crimson and then falls off. Fading foliage and stems should be cut completely to the ground when they become unattractive. New rosettes will form soon thereafter. **1 gal. 6.50**

**ONOCLEA** oh-nok'-li-uh

*Onoclea sensibilis* (N) ..... **Sensitive Fern**  
 3-4' x 3-4' **Pt shade/shade** Deciduous  
 Roughly-textured, medium to large native deciduous Fern with bright yellowish-green sterile fronds and much smaller, upright and narrower fertile fronds. Can form large colonies from creeping rhizomes where happy. **1 gal. 8.50**

**OPHIPOGON** oh-fi-o-poh'-gon

*Ophiopogon japonicus* 'Nana' ..... **Dwarf Mondo Grass**  
 .25-.5' x .5'-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Small, evergreen clumps of narrow, dusky-green leaves spread slowly from underground stolons. Spikes of whitish flowers open in the summer. Low-growing plants are useful for edging and groundcover. Tolerates full sun but prospers best in evenly moist soil and partial shade. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Ophiopogon japonicus* 'Variegatus' ..... **Variegated Mondo Grass**  
 .5' x .5'-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
 Low, dense, evergreen tufts of green- and white-variegated foliage. Useful as an underplanting for dark-green shrubby or as a groundcover. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Ophiopogon planiscapus* 'Nigrescens' ..... **Black Mondo Grass**  
 .5-1 x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Thick clumps of narrow, curving, almost-black leaves slowly develop from tuberous roots. Spikes of pinkish blooms rise slightly above the foliage in summer. Impressive when underplanted with *Lysimachia nummularia* 'Aurea.' **1 qt. 6.50**

**ORIGANUM** oh-rig'-a-num

*Origanum majorana* ..... **Sweet Marjoram**  
 1-2' x .5-1' **Full sun** Jul-Aug  
 Culinary herb whose aromatic foliage is traditionally used as a seasoning for meat dishes. Best cultivated in sunny locations with sharp drainage and rich, sweet soils. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Origanum vulgare* 'Aureum' ..... **Golden Oregano**  
 .5-1' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Aug  
 Although it produces clusters of fairly-inconspicuous, small, white flowers during the summer, this plant is valued more for its ornamental, aromatic golden leaves which cover its creeping stems. Well-cultivated plants can quickly form dense patches. **1 qt. 4.50**

**OSMUNDA** os-mun-da

*Osmunda cinnamomea* ..... **Cinnamon Fern**  
 2-2.5' x 2.5-3' **Partial shade** Deciduous  
 Tall, upright fronds that are pale-green and deeply cut. The common name comes from the sterile fronds that rise from the center of the crown and resemble "cinnamon sticks." **1 gal. 9.50**

*Osmunda regalis* ..... **Royal Fern**  
 4-6' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Deciduous  
 A tall, stately fern with an upright growth habit. Plants go dormant for the winter and prefer cultivation in highly acid soils and moist situations. **1 gal. 9.50**

**PAEONIA** pee-oh'-ni-a

*Paeonia lactiflora* 'Festiva Maxima' ..... **Garden Peony**  
 2-2.5' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
 Fragrant, double white flowers flecked with red. "Old Reliable" with strong stems. **1 gal. 18.50**

- Paeonia lactiflora* ‘Kansas’ ..... **Garden Peony**  
2.5-3' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
Handsome and vigorous plants with dark-green leaves provide double, watermelon-red blooms in the spring. Long-lasting blossoms make good cut flowers. **1 gal. 18.50**
- Paeonia lactiflora* ‘Paula Fay’ ..... **Garden Peony**  
2.5-3' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** Apr-May  
Large, deep-pink, semi-double flowers whose petals have a soft, waxy glow and surround a conspicuous center of golden-yellow stamens. An early bloomer. **1 gal. 18.50**
- Paeonia lactiflora* ‘Renato’ ..... **Garden Peony**  
2.5-2.75' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
Fragrant, red, double blooms open above plants with attractive dark-green leaves in the spring. **1 gal. 18.50**
- Paeonia lactiflora* ‘Sarah Bernhardt’ ..... **Garden Peony**  
2-2.5' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** May-Jun  
Double, apple-blossom-pink flowers in late-spring. **1 gal. 18.50**
- Paeonia lactiflora* ‘Shirley Temple’ .... **Garden Peony**  
2.5-3' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** Apr-May  
Double blooms open a blush-pink and mature to white. **1 gal. 18.50**

**PARDANCANDA** par-dan-kan'-da

- x *Pardancanda* ‘Lollipop’ ..... **Dwarf Candy Lily**  
1.5-2' x 1.5' **Full sun** Jul-Aug  
A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION. Bi-generic Candy Lilies we developed by crossing selected colors of x *Pardancanda* with *Belamcanda flabellata*. From the progeny, we've chosen bloom hues including deep mahogany-reds, pinks, lavenders, and purples produced by plants with a dwarfish growth habit like that of the Yellow Blackberry Lilies. **1 gal. 8.50**

**PATRINIA** pat-ree'-ni-a

- Patrinia scabiosifolia* ..... **Golden Lace Flower**  
3-6' x 2' **Full sun** Jun-Aug  
Tall stems with large umbels of bright-yellow flowers are produced freely in the summer. Bold, handsome foliage turns scarlet in the fall. Virtually pest-free. A beautiful filler in the garden and a great cut flower. **1 gal. 7.50**

**PENNISETUM** pen-i-see'-tum

- Pennisetum alopecuroides* ‘Moudry’ ..... **Purple Fountain Grass**  
2-4' x 2-3.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Aug-Oct  
Bristly, reddish-purple flower spikes appear from late-summer to early-autumn above narrow, gracefully arching, dark-green leaves. **1 gal. 6.50**

**PENSTEMON** pen-stay'-mon

- Penstemon digitalis* ‘Husker Red’ (N) ..... **Beardtongue**  
2.5-3' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Spikes of white, Foxglovelike blooms rise above attractive clumps of maroon-tinted foliage in late-spring and early-summer. Plant in a sunny location in soil with especially good drainage. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Penstemon x mexicali* ..... **Miniature Bells**  
1-1.75' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Aug  
Profuse bell-shaped blooms in shades of pink, rose, or purple appear during the summer against basal rosettes of bluish-green foliage. **1 gal. 6.50**

**PEROVSKIA** per-ov'-skee-uh

- Perovskia* ‘Filigran’ ..... **Russian Sage**  
3-4' x 2-3' **Full sun** Jun-Jul  
Dense, slender, upright branches covered with finely-cut, felt-textured, silvery-green leaves provide airy spikes of steely-blue flowers for an extended period during the summer. Plants require soils with excellent drainage and placement in sunnier sites to thrive. **1 gal. 8.50**

**PHLOX** flox

- Phlox glaberrima* ‘Triflora’ (N) ..... **Smooth Phlox**  
1-1.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** May  
Large heads of purple flowers with paler eyes are on short stems that rise from masses of spreading foliage. As easy to cultivate as it is beautiful in the garden. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Phlox paniculata* ‘Common Purple’ (N) ..... **Summer Phlox**  
3-4' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION. Large clusters of small, deep-lilac blossoms top thick, sturdy stems. Prefers rich, loamy, well-drained soil kept evenly moist. Avoid extended periods of dryness. Water deeply and provide good air circulation to help prevent powdery mildew. An exceptional garden Phlox for the South. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Phlox paniculata* ‘David’ (N) ..... **Summer Phlox**  
3-4' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
Large clusters of radiant-white, fragrant blooms are produced on tall, mildew-resistant plants. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Phlox paniculata* ‘David's Lavender’ (N) .... **Summer Phlox**  
3-4' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
Big, rounded spikes of tightly-packed, fragrant, lavender-pink blooms begin opening in mid-summer produced by tall, mildew-resistant plants. Deadheading encourages reblooming into the fall. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Phlox paniculata* ‘Franz Schubert’ (N) .... **Summer Phlox**  
2.5-3' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
Clusters of lilac flowers open at the tops of upright stems in the summer. **1 gal. 6.50**
- Phlox subulata* ‘Emerald Cushion Blue’ (N) ..... **Thrift**  
.5' x 1' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
Clear-blue flowers cover mossy-green, spreading foliage. Good for slopes, edging, or rock gardens. **1 gal. 6.50**

**PHYSOSTEGIA** fy-so-stee'-gi-a

- Physostegia virginiana* ‘Rose Queen’ (N) ..... **Obedient Plant**  
1.5-2' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Aug-Sep  
Vigorous plants provide late-season color with clusters of bright rose-pink flowers arranged in terminal spikes. Useful in the border or in the wild garden, *Physostegia* offers an abundant supply of beautiful flowers attractive to butterflies and suitable for cutting. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Platycodon* 'Sentimental Blue' ..... **Balloon Flower**  
 .5' x .5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jul  
 Three-inch, blue, bell-shaped blooms open from balloon-like buds on compact, leafy plants with Carrot-like roots. This useful perennial bedding plant prefers moist, but well-drained soil and dappled shade during the hotter part of the day. **1 qt. 4.50**

**PLEIOBLASTUS** ply-oh-blas'-tus

*Pleioblastus shibuyanensis* 'Tsuboi' ..... **Cream-striped Bamboo**  
 3-6' x 2-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Semi-evergreen  
 Clumps of low-growing culms cloaked in dark-green foliage with cream stripes of varying widths develop best coloration in sunnier spots. A beautiful smaller Bamboo ideal for containers. **1 gal. 12.50**

*Pleioblastus viridistriatus* ..... **Golden Bamboo**  
 2-2.5' x 2.5-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Semi-evergreen  
 Low-growing Bamboo with green-striped, golden-yellow leaves makes a brilliant groundcover in sunnier sites. Cut back in the fall or early-spring for best foliage effect. Can also be cultivated in containers. (Synonym: *Arundinaria auricoma*) **1 gal. 12.50**

**POLYGONATUM** pah-li-goh-nay'-tum

*Polygonatum odoratum* 'Variegatum' ..... **Variegated Soloman's Seal**  
 1-1.5' x 2-2.5' **Partial shade** May  
 Dainty white bell-shaped flowers dangle from long, arching stems with variegated leaves. They grow best in cool, moist soils where their rhizomes can be left undisturbed to spread freely. **1 gal. 9.50**

**POLYSTICHUM** poh-lis'-ti-kum

*Polystichum acrostichoides* (N) ..... **Christmas Fern**  
 2' x 2' **Pt shade/shade** Semi-evergreen  
 A native fern with broad, dark-green foliage which is evergreen through normal winters. Will form large clumps and naturalizes easily. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Polystichum polyblepharum* ..... **Tassel Fern**  
 2-2.5' x 2' **Pt shade/shade** Evergreen  
 Glossy, dark-green fronds form a coarse-textured, rounded, evergreen rosette. Prefers a rich, loamy, acid soil. **1 gal. 8.50**

**PRATIA** pra'-tee-a

*Pratia pedunculata* ..... **Blue Star Creeper**  
 .25' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Jun  
 Small, pale-blue, star-shaped flowers hover above very low, dense mats of tiny, rounded leaves in spring and early-summer. This creeping groundcover grows most vigorously in moist but well-drained soil. (Synonym: *Laurentia fluviatilis*) **1 qt. 4.50**

**REHMANNIA** reh-mah'-ni-a

*Rehmannia angulata* ..... **Chinese Foxglove**  
 .75-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-Jun  
 Magenta, Foxglove-like blooms with yellow throats open on leafy stems rising above basal rosettes of foliage in late-spring, early-summer. Plant in rich, well-drained soil. **1 gal. 6.50**

**ROHDEA** roh'-dee-uh

*Rohdea japonica* ..... **Lily-of-China**  
 2-3' x 2-3' **Shade** Evergreen  
 This durable member of the Lily family is grown primarily for its arching tufts of leathery, long-lasting foliage. It thrives in densely shaded sites. Inconspicuous spikes of yellow flowers nestled among its leaves produce a red-pulped berry. **1 gal. 12.50**

**ROSMARINUS** roh-z-ma-ry'-nus

*Rosmarinus officinalis* 'Arp' ..... **Rosemary**  
 3-3.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Nov-Apr  
 Small, blue flowers nestle among the aromatic foliage during the cooler months of the year. Needs well-drained, alkaline soil to thrive. 'Arp' is thought to be more cold-hardy than the species. **1 gal. 7.50**

*Rosmarinus officinalis* 'Huntington Carpet' ..... **Prostrate Rosemary**  
 1-2' x 3-6' **Full sun/pt shade** Nov-Apr  
 Spreading mounds of aromatic, dark silvery-green, needle-like leaves are covered by small bright-blue flowers from late-fall into the spring. Best planted in sunnier sites with especially well-drained soil. **1 gal. 7.50**

*Rosmarinus officinalis* 'Tuscan Blue' ..... **Rosemary**  
 1-2' x 3-6' **Full sun/pt shade** Nov-Apr  
 Bright, violet-blue flowers are scattered throughout aromatic evergreen foliage. Prefers well-drained, alkaline soil and should be protected from harsh, drying winds and the coldest winter weather. **1 gal. 7.50**

**RUDBECKIA** rud-bek'-i-a

*Rudbeckia fulgida* 'Goldsturm' (N) ..... **Black Eyed Susan**  
 2-2.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Sep  
 Large, bright-yellow flowers with large black cones in the centers. An easily-grown and long-lived species. Prefers rich, moist soils. Excellent cut flower. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Rudbeckia* 'Herbstsonne' (N) ..... **Coneflower**  
 4-5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Sep  
 Large, rounded green leaves will form a basal rosette from which rise tall and sturdy multi-branched flower stems. Long, pale-yellow petals surrounding tall green cones produce an amazing display in late-summer. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Rudbeckia hirta* 'Indian Summer' (N) ..... **Gloriosa Daisy**  
 3-3.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Frost  
 Six-inch, golden-yellow flowers with dark central cones are produced on tall, leafy plants for an extended period during the summer. This short-lived perennial species is best cultivated in moderately fertile, well-drained soils. Good selection for the cutting garden. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Rudbeckia nitida* (N) ..... **Glossy-leaf Coneflower**  
 3.5-5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Sep  
 Golden-yellow flowers with greenish central cones open in late-summer and early-fall on leafy stalks rising from clumps of pale-green, toothy-margined leaves. Foliage has the look of polished leather. Rarely found in cultivation nowadays. **1 gal. 6.50**

**SALVIA** sal'-vi-a

*Salvia argentea* ..... **Silver Sage**  
 2-3' x 2' **Full sun** May-Jun  
 Large white flowers on spiked stems. Large wooly, silvery foliage in broad clumps is the main attraction. Prefers good drainage and relatively dry soils. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia guaranitica* 'Argentine Skies' ..... **Anise Sage**  
 3-5' x 2-4' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
 Pale sky-blue, funnel-shaped flowers cover large plants with rich-green foliage from mid-summer into the fall. Plant in moist but well-drained soil in locations receiving some shade during the hotter portion of the day. Very attractive to hummingbirds. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia guaranitica* 'Black & Blue' ..... **Anise Sage**  
 4-6' x 3-5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
 Large, fuzzy-leaved sub-shrub provides spikes of nectar-rich blue blooms subtended by almost-black calyxes. Plant in well-drained soil rich in organic material. Deadheading encourages reblooming. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia guaranitica* 'Purple Majesty' ..... **Anise Sage**  
 3-5' x 2-4' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
 Large subshrub provides spikes of nectar-rich, tubular, purple flowers throughout the growing season when properly cultivated. Plant in well-drained soil rich in organic matter. Keep plants deadheaded to encourage repeat blooms.. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia leucantha* ..... **Mexican Sage**  
 4-5' x 3-3.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Frost  
 Rich violet-purple, fleecy flowers with tubular white corollas on long stems. May be pinched until August to promote branching and control height. Although tender in north Georgia, it is unsurpassed for its fall display. Inflorescences are good for cutting. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia lyrata* 'Purple Volcano' (N) ..... **Lyre Leaf Sage**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
 Compact native plant grown primarily for its colorful bronzy-purple foliage which turns a rich, deep-purple in the fall. Purple-stemmed spikes of small white blooms open during the summer. Good container plant. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia microphylla* 'Hot Lips' (N) ..... **Small Leaf Sage**  
 2-3' x 2.5-3' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Oct  
 Two-lipped white flowers—both lips painted a bright-red—begin opening in late-spring. The finely-textured plants with smallish leaves continue providing colorful blooms into the fall. Best in sunnier sites with well-drained soil. Closely related to *Salvia greggii*. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia officinalis* 'Berggarten' ..... **Garden Sage**  
 2.5-3' x 2.5-3' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Cultivar of the culinary Garden Sage whose broader, more rounded leaves are purportedly more intensely flavorful than those of the species. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Salvia officinalis* 'Purpurescens' ..... **Purple Sage**  
 2-2.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun** June  
 The grayish-green, woolly leaves of this version of Garden Sage are beautifully edged in purplish-red. Once established, this hardy perennial is fairly drought-resistant; so, avoid overwatering. It thrives in almost any well-drained soil. **1 gal. 6.50**

**SARCOCOCCA** sar-ko-kok'-a

*Sarcococca confusa* ..... **Sweet Box**  
 3-5' x 3-5' **Pt shade/shade** Feb-Mar  
 A densely-branched evergreen shrub which produces small, very fragrant, cream-colored flowers that are followed later by small, black fruits. A great addition to the shade garden. **3 gal. 32.50**

**SARRACENIA** sar-uh-sen'-i-a

*Sarracenia* 'Dana's Delight' (N) ..... **Pitcher Plant**  
 .75-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
 This pitcher plant is the result of a cross between *Sarracenia* 'Willissi' and *S. leucophylla*. Slender tubular leaves with green bases are topped by white hoods fretted with green threads which age to maroon by the end of summer. They thrive in poor, wet, acid soil. **1 qt. 8.50**

*Sarracenia* 'Judith Hindle' (N) ..... **Pitcher Plant**  
 .75-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
 Hybrid plants developed by Alan Hindle and introduced by Peter D'Amato of California Carnivores. Compact pitchers are canopied by hoods with sinuously undulating margins. Leaves emerge green dappled in whites and yellows and age to maroon by late-summer. **1 qt. 8.50**

*Sarracenia leucophylla* 'Tarnok' (N) ..... **Pitcher Plant**  
 1-3' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
 Big, unusual, red blooms appear in the spring preceding the emergence of upright, flaring tubular leaves with green bases and pure-white lips and lids webbed in reddish tracery. Perhaps the handsomest of the native Pitcher Plants. **1 qt. 8.50**  
**1 gal. 16.50**

*Sarracenia* 'Scarlet Belle' (N) ..... **Pitcher Plant**  
 .75-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Apr  
 Rosettes formed of slanting, leaning pitchers with green bases and white, scarlet-veined tops and hoods send up stalks bearing unusual red blooms in the spring. Cultivate in moist, acid soils in sunnier situations. Requires very little fertilizer. **1 qt. 8.50**

**SAXIFRAGA** saks-ee-frag'-a

*Saxifraga stolonifera* ..... **Strawberry Begonia**  
 .5' x 1-2' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-May  
 Small white flowers in airy racemes emerge through and hover above clusters of rounded, hairy leaves. Leaves are dark-green and marked with silver on their tops and colored red on their undersides. Spreads rapidly from runners making an excellent groundcover. **1 gal. 6.50**

**SCABIOSA** skab-ee-oh'-sa

*Scabiosa columbaria* 'Butterfly Blue' ..... **Pincushion Flower**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun** Apr-Aug  
 Lavender-blue, domed flowerheads on wiry stems rise above compact mounds of basal foliage in the summer. Continual blooms all season if regularly dead-headed. Plant in well-drained, neutral to slightly alkaline soil. Excellent cut flower. **1 gal. 6.50**

**SEDUM** see'-dum

*Sedum* 'Autumn Fire' ..... **Stonecrop**  
 2-3' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Aug-Oct  
 Tight clumps of tall, blue-green, succulent foliage and sturdy stalks holding large heads of bright rosy-pink blooms in late-summer. Long-lasting flowers age to salmon and then to coppery-red by the end of fall. Grow in average to lean garden soil provided with excellent drainage. Attracts butterflies, bees and hummingbirds. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Sedum* 'Autumn Joy' ..... **Stonecrop**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Aug-Oct  
 Large heads of small coral-pink flowers that turn deep rusty-red with age. Spectacular fall color and an exceptionally easy plant to cultivate. **1 gal. 6.50**

**SELAGINELLA** se-lah-gi-nel'-a

*Selaginella kraussiana* 'Aurea' .... **Spreading Clubmoss**  
 .25-.5' x .75-1' **Pt shade/shade** Semi-evergreen  
 Delightful low-growing plants to brighten shady areas. Tiny new leaves are golden-yellow aging to chartreuse. Trailing stems form dense mats in sites with good air circulation and evenly moist, well-drained soils. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Selaginella uncinata* ..... **Peacock Spikemoss**  
 .25-.5' x .75-1' **Pt shade/shade** Semi-evergreen  
 Dense, compact mats of iridescent, blue-green foliage make good groundcover between Ferns. Spreads fairly rapidly if planted in well-drained, acid soil kept consistently moist and provided with good air circulation. Best color in bright, filtered light. **1 qt. 4.50**

**SOLIDAGO** sol-i-day'-goh

*Solidago rugosa* 'Fireworks' (N) ..... **Goldenrod**  
 3-3.5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Sep-Oct  
 Rough-leaved native plants create a bedazzling display in the fall when arching spikes of small, golden-yellow flowers make their yearly appearance. Shorter, more compact, and less stoloniferous than some of the other Goldenrods. Good cut flower. **1 gal. 6.50**

**STACHYS** stay'-kis

*Stachys byzantina* ..... **Lamb's Ears**  
 .5-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Small purple flowers on woolly spikes. Dries easily. Gray, woolly foliage forms nice clumps and spreads easily. Prefers a poor, well-drained soil. (Synonym: *Stachys lanata*) **1 gal. 6.50**

**STIPA** sty'-puh

*Stipa tenuissima* 'Ponytails' ..... **Angel's Hair Grass**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Brilliant-green tufts of grass with needle-thin, flexible, arching blades are graced in early-summer by feathery, tannish flowerheads. Best grown in sunny spots in soil with good drainage. **1 gal. 6.50**

**STOKESIA** sto-kee'-zhi-a

*Stokesia laevis* - Blue (N) ..... **Blue Stokes Aster**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Large, lavender-blue flowers on fourteen inch stems. Dark-green, straplike foliage forms handsome clumps. An excellent garden perennial and good cut flower. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Stokesia laevis* - White (N) ..... **White Stokes Aster**

1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Large, clear-white flowers. Beautiful when combined with blue Stokes Aster. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Stokesia laevis* 'Mary Gregory' .... **Yellow Stokes Aster**

1-1.25' x 1-1.25' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Pale-yellow, single blooms open in late-spring and early-summer against rosettes of deep-green, strap-like leaves. Plants are evergreen and may flower sporadically through the summer. Introduced by Niche Gardens of Chapel Hill, NC. **1 gal. 6.50**

**TEUCRIUM** tew'-kree-um

*Teucrium chamaedrys* ..... **Germander**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** June  
 Rosy-purple flowers on stiff stems. Shrubby plant with rich-green, semi-evergreen foliage. Frequently used as a dwarf clipped hedge for knot gardens or herb gardens. **1 qt. 4.50**

**THALICTRUM** tha-lik'-trum

*Thalictrum aquilegifolium* ..... **Meadow Rue**  
 3-3.5' x 2-2.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jul  
 Clusters of rosy-purple flowers on tall, slender stems which rise from dense clumps of *Aquilegia*-like foliage. Plants thrive in rich, loamy soils. **1 gal. 7.50**

*Thalictrum flavum* ssp. *glaucum* ..... **Dusty Meadow Rue**  
 3-5' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 Graceful sprays of tufted yellow blooms are held above robust plants with ferny, blue-gray foliage. Best planted in the back border in well-drained, loamy soil. **1 gal. 7.50**

**THELYPTERIS** the-lip'-ter-is

*Thelypteris kunthii* (N) ..... **Southern Wood Fern**  
 2-3' x 2' **Pt shade/shade** Deciduous  
 A hardy Fern grown in wet to moist soils. Fronds are erect and form large, upright, spreading clumps. (Synonym: *T. normalis*) **1 gal. 8.50**

**THERMOPSIS** ther-mop'-sis

*Thermopsis caroliniana* (N) ..... **Carolina Lupine**  
 2.5-4' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Long, erect spikes of bright-yellow flowers resembling Pea blossoms rise above dense mounds of blue-green foliage on semi-woody stems. An easily cultivated and long-lived plant for the back of the border. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Thermopsis lanceolata* ..... **False Lupine**  
 1.5-2.5' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr  
 Six- to eight-inch spikes of yellow, Pealike blooms rise above clumps of attractive trifoliate foliage in early-spring. **1 gal. 7.50**

**THYMUS** tym'-us

*Thymus citriodorus* 'Aureus' ..... **Gold-edged Lemon Thyme**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Jul  
 A Lemon Thyme whose green leaves have bright-gold margins. A beautiful foliar color contrast. Should be divided from time to time to preserve variegation. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Thymus praecox* 'Elfin' ..... **Creeping Thyme**  
 .25' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Dense mats of evergreen, aromatic foliage composed of minute, dark-green leaves on very low-growing, spreading plants. Perfect for planting between paving stones in the walkway. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Thymus praecox* 'Splendens' ..... **Creeping Thyme**  
 .25' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Apr-May  
 Lavender flowers cover the low, evergreen foliage in the spring. Good drainage is essential. Expect the plant to spread across unoccupied soils. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Thymus vulgaris* 'Argenteus' ..... **Silver-edged Thyme**  
 .5-1' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
 Attractive variety of English Thyme whose gray-green leaves have silvery margins. **1 gal. 6.50**

**TIARELLA**<sub>ty-a-rel'-a</sub>

*Tiarella cordifolia* (N) ..... **Foam Flower**  
 1' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-May  
 Small white flowers in spiky racemes rise six to eight inches above attractive evergreen foliage in the spring. Prefers rich, loamy soil that is kept evenly moist but not wet. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Tiarella* 'Dark Star' (N) ..... **Foam Flower**  
 .75-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Apr-May  
 In the spring, airy spikes of small, pinkish-white flowers on wiry stems rise just above mounds of Maple-shaped, mint-green leaves with dark-maroon central veins. Grow in humusy, organically-rich soils kept evenly moist but not wet. **1 gal. 8.75**

**TRACHYCARPUS**<sub>tray-kee-kar'-pus</sub>

*Trachycarpus fortunei* ..... **Windmill Palm**  
 6-8' x 4-5' **Full sun/pt shade** Evergreen  
 One of the few Palms that can be cultivated outside in cool, temperate zones. Best planted in sites with some protection from the wind to prevent tattering of the attractive, rounded, palmate fronds. Intolerant of wet, soggy soil conditions. **2 gal. 28.50**

**TRADERSCANTIA**<sub>trad-es-kan'-ti-a</sub>

*Tradescantia* 'Concord Grape' (N) ..... **Spiderwort**  
 1.5-2' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Oct  
 During the early-summer, grape-purple blooms open for an extended period at the ends of leafy scapes emerging from clumps of grassy, bluish-green leaves. Best flowering in sunny situations. Some reblooming often occurs in the autumn. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Tradescantia* 'Little Doll' (N) ..... **Spiderwort**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Oct  
 Clusters of pale-pink flowers open at the ends of leafy, fleshy stems rising from compact clumps of grassy leaves in early-summer. Cutting back the plants at midseason when they become untidy encourages new growth and reblooming in the fall. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Tradescantia* 'Little White Doll' (N) ..... **Spiderwort**  
 1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Oct  
 Similar in growth characteristics and cultivation requirements to the Spiderwort described just above but differing in the flower color. This one provides clear-white flowers. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Tradescantia* 'Snowcap' (N) ..... **Spiderwort**  
 1.5-3' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Oct  
 White flowers in clusters at the ends of upright, fleshy stems rising from clumps of grasslike foliage. **1 gal. 6.50**

**TRICYRTIS**<sub>try-ser'-tis</sub>

*Tricyrtis* 'Empress' ..... **Toad Lily**  
 2-2.5' x 1.5-2' **Pt shade/shade** Sep-Oct  
 Fall-flowering plants for the shady woodland garden. Starry white blooms dotted with dark reddish-purple markings are larger than those of the typical Toad Lily. Best in slightly acid soil which is kept evenly moist. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Tricyrtis formosana* 'Samurai' ..... **Variegated Toad Lily**  
 1-1.25' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Jul-Aug  
 Small, stoloniferous plants with gold-margined leaves produce interesting lavender-purple blooms with crimson freckles in the late-summer. Plants spread slowly, eventually forming large clumps. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Tricyrtis hirta* ..... **Hairy Toad Lily**

 Unusual lavender flowers with dark-purple to black spots are produced in every leaf joint. Dark- to medium-green leaves are arranged in pairs along the arching stems that rise from a spreading rootstock. **1 gal. 8.50**

*Tricyrtis* 'Tojen' ..... **Toad Lily**  
 2-3' x 1-1.5' **Pt shade/shade** Sep-Oct  
 Hybrid whose leaves are larger than those of most Toad Lily species. The lavender flowers open at the ends of two- to three-foot stems and fade to white in their centers as they age. Plants perform best in rich, moist soils with good drainage. **1 gal. 8.50**

**VERBENA**<sub>ver-bee'-na</sub>

*Verbena bonariensis* ..... **Tall Verbena**  
 3.5-4' x 2' **Full sun** May-Oct  
 Small clusters of dark lilac-purple flowers are on tall, branching stems. Dark-green leaves form a rough-textured base. Looks particularly good when planted in masses. An exceptional cut flower that reblooms quickly after cutting. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Verbena* 'Homestead Purple' ..... **Verbena**

 Small, bluish-purple flowers arranged in clusters open on low-growing, spreading plants with finely-cut foliage. Excellent groundcover. One cut-back is recommended in mid-season for all Verbenas. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Verbena tenuisecta* 'Alba' ..... **White Moss Verbena**  
 .5-1' x 1.5-2' **Full sun** May-Oct  
 Clusters of small, pure-white flowers on deeply-cut, fine foliage. A long-flowering beauty. **1 gal. 6.50**

**VERNONIA** ver-noh'-ni-a

*Vernonia gigantea* (N) ..... **Ironweed**  
5-10' x 1-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Jul-Sep  
Clusters of small, purple flowerheads terminate the towering, leafy stems of this imposing native wildflower which is often seen growing in moist soils by the roadsides and in the meadows and open woodlands of the South. (Synonym: *V. altissima*) **1 gal. 7.50**

**VERONICA** ver-on'-i-ka

*Veronica* 'Goodness Grows' ..... **Veronica**  
1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION. Spikes of beautiful violet-blue flowers. A wonderful dwarf volunteer in our trial gardens which we felt compelled to cultivate because of its neat habit and long-flowering performance. Excellent cut flower. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Veronica incana* ..... **Silver Speedwell**  
1-1.5' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
Neat, slowly spreading plants with attractive silvery-green foliage send up stiff spikes of violet-blue flowers in late-spring. Deadheading spent blooms extends the flowering period into the fall. Best in moderately fertile soil with good drainage. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Veronica peduncularis* 'Georgia Blue' ..... **Veronica**  
.5-1' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** Feb-Apr  
Bushy, semi-prostrate plants produce blue flowers with white centers in late-winter and the early-spring. Plant in moderately fertile, well-drained soil kept evenly moist. Good for edging at the front of the border or for use as a groundcover. **1 gal. 6.50**

*Veronica* 'Sunny Border Blue' ..... **Veronica**  
2' x 2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Aug  
Bluish-purple spikes top sturdy two foot tall plants. A great garden performer that reblooms if old flowers are removed. **1 gal. 6.50**

**VIOLA** vy-oh'-luh

*Viola labradorica* 'Purpurea' ..... **Labrador Violet**  
.25' x 1' **Pt shade/shade** April  
Lilac suffused with purple Violets appear in early-spring produced by little plants with small, broadly-oval leaves. New foliage emerging in the spring and fall is purple and turns dark-green during the summer. Spreads by creeping rhizomes and seeds. **1 qt. 4.50**

*Viola pedata* (N) ..... **Bird's Foot Viola**  
.25-.5' x .5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Oct  
Light-purple flowers on short stems above clumps of deeply-divided foliage. Prefers a relatively sunny location with well-drained soil. **4-inch 4.00**

*Viola pedata* 'Eco Artist's Palette' (N) ..... **Bird's Foot Viola**  
.25-.5' x .25-.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-Oct  
Tufting native wildflower with finely-divided leaves resembling bird's feet. Small Pansylike blooms open in early-spring. Flowers have orange centers surrounded by two dark violet-blue upper petals and three white or pale-blue lower petals. May reflower in late-summer and early-fall. **4-inch 4.00**

**WEIGELA** wy-gee'-la

*Weigela florida* 'Goodness Grows' ... **Bicolor Weigela**  
6-9' x 9-12' **Full sun** May-Jun  
A GOODNESS GROWS INTRODUCTION. Densely-branched, rounded shrub bears profuse funnelform blooms which open on old growth in late-spring. The cream-colored flowers age to a dark, rosy-pink. Best results obtained in sunny sites with well-drained soil. Another of Garden Designer Ryan Gainey's valuable discoveries. **3 gal. 32.50**

**WISTERIA** wis-tee'-ri-a

*Wisteria frutescens* 'Amethyst Falls' (N) ..... **Wisteria**  
25-30' x 3-4' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Aug  
Vigorous vines produce dense clusters of fragrant, golden-spotted, lilac blooms in the summer. Prefers a sunny location with moist but well-drained soil. **3 gal. 26.50**

**YUCCA** yuk'-uh

*Yucca filamentosa* 'Bright Edge' (N) ..... **Bear Grass**  
3-6' x 1.5-2' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
In late-spring and early-summer, closely-packed, conical panicles of nodding white flowers open on stalks well above clumps of stiffly erect and spreading, sword-shaped, evergreen leaves edged a rich yellow. **1 gal. 14.50**

**ZEPHYRANTHES** zef-er-an'-theez

*Zephyranthes candida* ..... **Rain Lily**  
.75-1' x .5-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Aug-Sep  
Crocus-like flowers with white petals and orange stamens face skyward at the ends of stalks above tufts of narrow, grassy leaves which emerge as the blooms open in late-summer. Best planted in sunny spots with well-drained-but-moisture-retentive soil. **1 qt. 4.50**

**On the Cover...Cont'd. from page 1...**

The illustration on the cover of the 2011 Goodness Grows catalog is of *Oenothera perennis*, a close relative of the "Evening Primrose" group of flowering plants but commonly called "Sundrops" rather than "Evening Primrose" because its flowers open during the day rather than in the evening. It thrives in hot and sunny exposures preferring well-draining soils of limited fertility; and, once established, it is very tolerant of drought.

*Oenothera perennis* forms mats of low, spreading, evergreen rosettes where happily situated. Then, from late-May until about mid-July, leafy stems rise up to two feet high bearing yellow, cup-shaped, diurnal flowers. The burden of the blooms may cause the stems to arch and cascade making "Sundrops" a suitable choice for planting at the front of a border, on a slope, atop low walls, or in the rock garden. After flowering ends in mid-summer, leaves turn a brilliant-red before falling as fresh, new crowns of foliage form at ground level.

Planting *Oenothera perennis* with *Nepeta* x *faassenii* 'Walker's Low,' *Salvia* 'Indigo Spires,' and *Kalimeris pinnatifida* makes a beautiful combination well worth trying!

*Ocimum basilicum* 'Red Rubin' ..... **Red Rubin Basil**  
1.5-2' x 1-1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** Jun-Sep  
Tender annual with aromatic, crinkled, dark reddish-purple leaves. Spires of small lavender-pink flowers begin opening in early-summer if plants are not kept pinched back. A beautiful ornamental plant for the garden or container as well as a culinary delight. **4 inch 1.25**

**PAPAVER** pap-ay'-fer

*Papaver nudicaule* 'Wonderland Mix' ..... **Dwarf Iceland Poppy**  
.75-1' x .5-1' **Full sun/pt shade** Mar-May  
Compact bedding plants with thick stems and small leaves produce big flowers in a kaleidoscope of hues including yellow, cream, red, orange, pink, rose, and white. After delivering their colorful display in the spring, plants decline after the arrival of summer's heat. **1 qt. 2.75**

**PETROSELINUM** pet-ro-se-ly'-num

*Petroselinum crispum* ..... **Curly Leaf Parsley**  
1.5-2.5' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
Green flowers in umbels appear the second year. Foliage is rich-green and deeply-cut. Traditional culinary Parsley. Biennial. **4 inch 1.25**

*Petroselinum crispum* 'Neopolitanum' ..... **Flat Leaf Italian Parsley**  
1.5-2' x 1.5' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Jun  
One of the most popular and essential of the culinary herbs, the flat leaves of Italian Parsley are considered more flavorful than those of the curly-leaved varieties. Plants are biennial. **4 inch 1.25**

**SALVIA** sal'-vi-a

*Salvia coccinea* 'Coral Nymph' (N) ..... **Scarlet Sage**  
1.5-2' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
Whorls of salmon and white bicolored trumpets arranged in large spikes are produced all summer on dense, leafy bedding plants. **1 qt. 2.75**

*Salvia coccinea* 'Snow Nymph' (N) ..... **Scarlet Sage**  
1.5-2' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
Large, showy spikes of snow-white funnel-shaped flowers can be encouraged from bushy plants all season by cutting spent flower stems. Excellent heat- and drought-tolerant bedding plant for southern gardens. **1 qt. 2.75**

*Salvia farinacea* 'Rhea' ..... **Mealycup Sage**  
1-1.5' x .5-1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
Deep violet-blue spikes of closely-packed tubular flowers on slender stems above shiny-green, compact foliage. Beautiful planted *en masse*. Useful in either fresh or dried arrangements. **1 qt. 2.75**

**ZINNIA** zin'-ni-a

*Zinnia linearis* 'Crystal White' ..... **Narrowleaf Zinnia**  
.75-1' x .75-1' **Full sun/pt shade** May-Frost  
Once they start blooming in late-spring, these floriferous little flower factories continue to provide small, single, white blooms with yellow centers throughout the summer. They perform beautifully either in the garden or cultivated in containers. **4 inch 1.25**

## Ordering Details

**Are You Sure?:** First, be certain you really want to have live plants packed up in a box and shipped to you from a distant location. We highly recommend shopping for container-grown plants by this method only as a last resort. If at all possible, it is best and safest to personally select and buy the plants you want from local sources.

If you cannot find the plants you desire nearby, it may be because they do not grow well where you live. Remember, our plants are grown in Georgia, and the greater your distance from us, the more cautious you need to be about trying to grow plants that may have been selected by us because they are adapted to the environmental conditions found here in our part of the Deep South. If you do not know them already, a little research on the cultivation requirements for the plants you want to order are essential.

To find if a plant will thrive where you intend to plant it, a good person to consult first is your local agricultural extension agent. Other resources include plant reference books in your public library and—probably the best fountains of information—experienced gardeners and gardening associations in your area.

**The Cost(liness):** Next, after determining the plants you crave are perfectly suited for conditions in your garden (or, if you have been able to alter conditions to suit the plants), consider the cost. It is expensive! The prices listed in this catalog are the ones charged to customers who shop and pick up their plants here at the nursery. We add an additional twenty-five percent to that price for plants we process and box for shipping to compensate for packing material and for the extra labor involved in pulling the plants from our growing fields and then carefully packing them for their journeys to faraway places. Oh yes, and for the extra paperwork, too.

We now require a minimum order of \$20.00 of plant material (before the addition of the twenty-five percent boxing charge). Plants going west of the Mississippi River are sent via U.P.S. Three Day Select. Orders traveling to destinations east of the Mississippi River go U.P.S. Ground. Shipping charges are a minimum of \$8.00 for Ground and \$10.00 for Three Day Select. If the actual U.P.S. charge for delivering your plants is greater than the minimum, the shipping charge you are billed will be the greater amount. Depending upon how far away you are and how heavy the boxes containing the plants you ordered weigh, it is quite possible for the UPS shipping charges to be more than the cost of the plants.

**Our Guarantee:** Finally, there is some extra responsibility you must bear if you elect to have our plants shipped to you. We can guarantee you the plants we pack up and ship are true-to-name and healthy and ready for transplanting into the ground. We can assure you they are packaged very, very carefully and leave our nursery via the safest, speediest transportation we can arrange. (If you receive

plant material from us and feel any of the above conditions have not been fulfilled, you need to let us know right away.) However, after U.P.S. picks up the plants we have carefully grown, they are out of our nurturing hands and beyond our care, and it is up to U.P.S. to get your order to you quickly and safely as they are supposed to do and into your tender, loving care. When your order arrives, open it immediately and water your plants if they are dry and plant them as soon as possible in that perfect spot you have properly prepared for them well before their arrival. If you cannot get them into the ground right away, put them in a shady spot (where they won't dry out as quickly) and keep a close eye on them. They require more attention while they remain in pots than they will after they have been planted and established themselves in the ground.

**To Order:** Of course, you may now have gotten the impression we are attempting to dampen your enthusiasm for gardening. That is not true! We just want you to be a little better informed and more likely a successful gardener than a disappointed one. You may order by filling out the form on the next page and either mailing or faxing it to us or by using the form as a worksheet and calling us with the information you have recorded on it. We accept orders and ship them in the spring from the first of March until the end of May unless the weather gets too hot to safely box and ship before then. Fall ordering and shipping dates are between the first of September and the end of November, weather permitting. Orders we receive by 5:00 PM (Eastern Time) on Fridays will be processed and picked up by U.P.S. the following Monday or Tuesday unless local weather conditions (or some other irksome situation beyond our control) prevents shipping. We can accept orders only for those plants we currently have in stock ready for sale and then only if they can be safely packed for shipping. (There are some either too large or too fragile for boxing and traveling.)

After U.P.S. picks up your order and we are informed of the shipping cost, we will add the U.P.S. shipping charges to your invoice, bill your credit card, and mail you a copy of both the completed invoice and your credit card receipt. If you mail or fax an order for plants that are presently not available, we will return your order to you and invite you to try ordering again later. Sorry, but we are unable to hold orders for a later shipment or track backorders. (You will know sooner whether or not we have available the plants you want and if they can be shipped to you if you place your order by phone.) Because we do not know what the shipping charges will be until plants are boxed, weighed, and picked up by U.P.S., there is no way to accurately compute final charges at the time an order is placed. For that reason, we will return any orders mailed to us with checks enclosed. And finally, we ship to addresses in the contiguous United States only, and we cannot ship any plant material to CA, OR, WA, or AZ.
